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My World Challenge Award Beavers

Overview & Timings

There are **seven main** tasks the children need to carry out to complete the 'My World Challenge Award' for Beavers. Below I have outlined roughly what I have created for your children to gain this badge.

Task 1 Meet Someone Who Serves The Community. It could Be A Police Officer, Lifeboat Crew, A Coastguard, Fire Fighter, Youth Worker Or Nurse

For this task the children will be entertained by a visitor. I have given you options of how to get someone who serves in your community to come and talk with the children.

Task 2 Work With Other Beaver Scouts To Make Something Or Complete A Challenge Or Activity Together

For this task you will take the children to a local park, setup some booths and show the community how to take care of this local area using some fun activities and games.

Task 3 Take Part In Three Activities That Reflect England, Northern Ireland, Scotland, Wales, Or Your Part Of The UK. They Could Be: Dance And Music, Craft, Festivals, Sports And Activities

For this task the children will participate in their very own 'United Kingdom Games'. They will sing a song from the countries of the 'United Kingdom' and participate in traditional games from that country.

Task 4 Find Out About And Take Part In An Act Of Worship, Reflection Or Celebration

For this task the children will do a little activity to learn a little about the 'Muslim' religion and Ramadan. They will then play a game called 'RunDan' that celebrates the end of Ramadan.

Task 5 Do Your Best And Show You Have Kept Your Beaver Promise. Share Or Talk About What You Have Done With Your Colony Or A Leader

For this task the children will demonstrate how they've done their best by carrying out acts of kindness over a seven day period. Then they will make some 'Smilestones'.

File name: 05A-Do your best and 05B-Smilestones

Task 6 Do At Least Three Of These Things: Junk Modelling, Pond Dipping, Mini-Beast Hunting, Growing Something From Seeds, Leaf Printing, Something Similar Agreed With Your Leader

For these tasks the children will...

Junk Modelling – get into teams of 3-4 and using unwanted junk from home and a few bits from you will create a ‘Fantasy Machine’.

File name: 06A-Junk Modelling

Growing Something From Seeds - grow some ‘Carrots’ as a group or individually depending on your budget.

File name: 06B-Growing from Seed

Leaf Printing - make their own leaf printed ‘Necker’.

File name: 06C-Leaf Printed Necker

Task 7 Take Part In Activities From Another Country. You Could Learn The Promise In Another Language Or Make A Dish From Another Country Or Culture

For this task the children will learn some brief information about the Indian Mehndi Tattoo tradition then they will paint a tattoo on each other’s hands.

Order Of Events

NOTE: Perform the tasks in this order. These timings are based on a meeting of about 1hr and takes into account your opening and closing ceremonies.

Task 3	The UK Games (run this over two weeks or as part of a sleepover or camp)	Allow 2 hrs. This may take a little longer depending on how many children you have in your group. Or you can cut down the time by playing just one game from each country.
