Overview

For this task the Beavers will get into teams of two and build a collage which will include the country’s flag and other information about that country.

Preparation Before The Meeting

1. Print out all the pictures found in this document. There is information about 14 different countries which is enough for 28 Beavers because they will be doing this activity in teams of two. If you have more than that then duplicate some of the countries (therefore some teams will do the same one)
2. Cut out all the pictures leave the names of the country on the flags and the currency symbols because they are so young they may not know which country the flag is from. Mix all the pictures up

Materials Needed For Each Team of Two

- Scissors, stick of glue and coloured pens
- An A4 sheet of paper and one spare

Preparation At The Meeting

1. Spread out all the pictures face up on a table
2. Give each team some coloured pens, scissors and a stick of glue

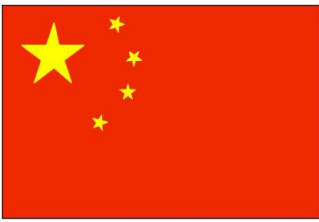
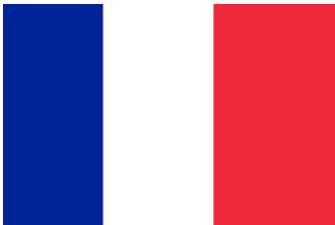
Directions/Leader Speak

1. **Speak** - The next task you need to do for your ‘Internaional Badge’ is draw a flag from 5 different countries across the world and tell someone a fact about that country.

So what you’re going to do is a little activity for us all to get to know about 14 different countries
2. **Speak** – In teams of two I want you to come up to this table and firstly choose a flag it will have the country’s name on it. This will be your country

Then you need to find four other bits of paper that say something about that country so for example, what was invented in that country, it’s currency symbol, the language spoken and a famous building
3. **Speak** - Then you will go back to your tables and make a collage on a sheet of paper with the pictures that you found. You can use your coloured pens to make a heading, draw the flag and add any labels or other pictures you wish
4. **Speak** - Before you actually use your glue to stick on your information we will come round to check everyone has the correct information because you may have another teams picture

5. **Speak** - Once everyone is finished each team will tell the rest of us the facts that they've gained about their country
6. **Direction** - Once they've all finished get them to sit in a circle and get each team to hold up their collage for everyone to see and tell the group something about their country

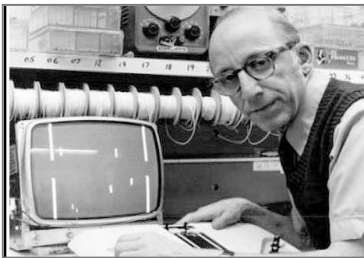

In 1453, Constantinople (today Istanbul) was conquered by the Ottoman **Turks** and Sultan Mehmed II ordered the building to be converted into a mosque



Moscow Kremlin

Kremlin with Cathedral of the Annunciation and Cathedral of the Archangel. The complex is the official residence of the President of **Russia**
