Learn How To Say A Greeting In A Language Other Than Your Own

Overview

There are **two** activities in this document to help the Beavers learn some Spanish phrases with you. I've prepared a section in this document for you to rehearse at home before you teach the kids.

Preparation Before The Meeting

1. Print the 'Spanish Practise For The Leader' section of this document and rehearse at home how to say the phrases you are going to teach the kids
2. Print out Lesson 1 to 4 – found in this document you need one for the teaching leader. Lesson 4 is an option lesson only use if you feel the Beavers are enjoying learning more
3. Print out 'Activity Two' – found at the end of this document – you need to copy for the leader

Materials Needed

Preparation At The Meeting

1. None

Directions/Leader Speak

1. **Speak** - The last task you need to complete for your 'International badge' is to learn how to say a greeting in another language. I have chosen Spanish because it's one of the top three most spoken languages
2. **Speak** – I'm going to teach you some basic phrases

Lesson 1 - Saying "Good Morning"

1. **Speak** - Let's learn how to say 'Good Morning'
2. **Action** - Read out loud the phrase and write it on the board ...
 - Buenos dias
3. **Action** - Again get the children to repeat it out loud several times

Lesson 3 - Saying "How Are You"

1. **Speak** - Let's learn how to say "How are you"
2. **Action** - Read out loud the phrase and write it on the board ...
 - Cómo estás
3. **Action** - Again get the children to repeat it out loud several times then one child says "How are you" and the other one says "Good thank you" or "Not Good" then get them to swap over

Answer...

- "Bien, Gracias" (good thank you)
- "No Bien" (not good)

Lesson 4 - Saying "See You Later"

1. **Speak** - Okay great everyone seems to be getting the hang of these simple phrases. Now let's learn how to say see you later
2. **Action** - Read out loud the phrase and write it on the board ...
 - ¡Hasta luego!
3. **Action** - Again get the children to repeat it out loud several times

Optional

Lesson 4 – Hello how's it going...Good thank you & you?

Directions/Leader Speak

1. **Speak** - I want you to get into pairs and greet each other how friends would to each other in Spain. The way they do this is they say ... **"Hello how's it going?"** and then the other person would say **"Good thank you, and you?"**
2. **Action** - Read out loud the question to the greeting and if you have a board write it on there so they can all see it...

. "Hola qué tal"

3. **Action** - Get the children to repeat it out loud together several times
4. **Action** - Now read out loud the answer to the greeting...

a. "Bien, Gracias y tú"

5. **Action** - Again get the children to repeat it out loud several times
6. **Speak** - Okay I want you to give each other a number 1 and 2
7. **Speak** - Now number 1 person has to say to number 2 person "Hola qué tal" (get them to do it with you the first time)
8. **Speak** - Now number 2 person has to say to number 1 person "Bien, Gracias y tú"
9. **Speak** - I want you to repeat what you have just done
10. **Speak** - Now swop. Number 2 person has to now say "Hola qué tal"
11. **Speak** - And number 1 person has to answer "Bien, Gracias y tú"
12. **Speak** - When people greet each other in Spain they hug and touch one cheek after the other (show them how). What I want you to do now is with your partner greet each other by hugging and touching each cheek. Once you have done this repeat the Spanish greeting you have just learnt.

Spanish Practise for the Leader

Phrase 1 - Practise "Good Morning"

Buenos dias – Good morning

Help with Pronunciation...

'Buenos' is pronounced 'bwenos'

'Dias' is pronounced 'deedas'

Phrase 2 – Practise - Saying "How Are You"

Cómo estás – How are you

Bien, Gracias - good thank you

No Bien - not good

Help with pronunciation

Cómo is pronounced as it's written - and the 'o' is pronounced as a lower case 'o' as a child learns to say it

Estas is pronounced as it's written - and the 'e' is pronounced as a lower case 'e'

Bien is pronounced 'be – en'

No is pronounced as it's written - and the 'o' is pronounced as a lower case 'o'

Gracias is pronounced 'gratheas'

Phrase 3 - Practise "See You Later"

Hasta luego – See you later

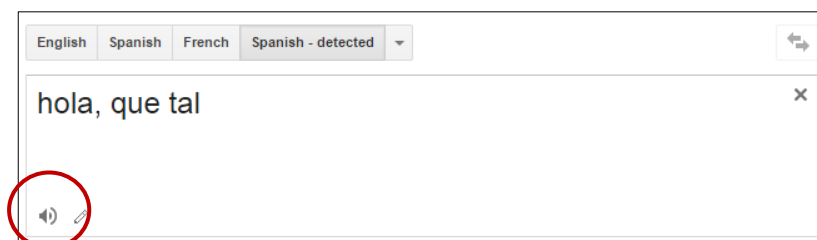
Help with pronunciation

Hasta is pronounced 'asta' (the Spanish do not pronounce the 'h')

Luego is pronounced as 'luago'

To listen to the phrases said in Spanish using Google

1. Go to <https://translate.google.com>
2. Type in the phrase for example, **hola, que tal** at the left then click the listen button



Optional...

Phrase 4 Practise – “Hello how’s it going”...“Good thank you & you”?...

Asking the question....

Hola qué tal - Hello how’s it going?

Help with pronunciation

Hola is pronounced olah (the Spanish do not pronounce the ‘h’)

qué is pronounced ‘ki’ and ‘tal’ is pronounced as it’s written

Answering the question....

Bien, Gracias y tú - Good thank you and you?

Help with pronunciation

Bien is pronounced ‘be – en’

Gracias is pronounced ‘gratheeas’

Y is pronounced ‘ee’

Tú is pronounced ‘to’

Activity Two - The following week - Repeat

1. Refresh the phrases learnt the previous week
2. Ask the following phrases in this order to different children. If a child can't give the answer in Spanish choose another child
3. Correct pronunciation where necessary
4. Once you've gone through all the phrases below if you have more than 11 children then start from the first phrase again until all the children have had a go at a phrase

If you need to, say in English what answer you are expecting.

Leader Speak to child	Child Answer to Leader	Leader Speak to child
Cómo estás	Bien, Gracias y tú	Bien
Hasta luego	¡Adiós! ¡Hasta pronto!	
Buenos días	Hola, Cómo estás	Bien, Gracias
Hola qué tal	Bien, Gracias y tú	Bien
